### **2004 Summit Hilltoppers**

Following two championship seasons, the 2004 Summit Hilltoppers broke even at 5-5. Whether the bottle is half full or half empty depends on how you look at it.

On one hand, Summit, after losing its first three games, won the last three games by a margin of nine points to pull even for the year.

On the other hand, the five losses were by an average of four touchdowns in each game.

There were many bright spots.

Quarterback Jake Huck, taking over the reins from the Schroeder boys, had an excellent season, completing 107 of 189 passes for 1,440 yards good for 13 touchdowns with only five interceptions.

Wide receiver Todd Kaiser, with 29 receptions, and John Stuckey, with 22 catches, were the main targets with each averaging more than 15 yards per-catch.

The running game was

bolstered by fullback Pearce Talbot and runningback Daryl Toney, along with Huck who scrambled for 300 yards during the season.

Gregg Jarrett also helped out with the ball carrying and returned punts and kickoffs very effectively.

The line was anchored by the outstanding play of seniors David Mell and Tim Feeley, who started on offense and made valuable contributions on defense as well.

The coaching staff of the

2004 Hilltoppers was led by Head Coach George DiGrande, his brother Frank, Steve Hughes, Tom Carrell, Matt Connell and last, but not least, Ray McCrann.

SFAA wishes all the best to Ray, who retired from the Summit school system in June.

Ray served on the SHS staff on three different occasions, including head coach of the 1994 state champions.

Thank you, Ray, for all your years of service to Summit.

### THE PRESENT: PROMISING

With a very strong nucleus of juniors returning for their senior year, there are high hopes for the Hilltoppers in their upcoming campaign and the promise of another championship season.

On offense, the Hilltoppers will rely on the return of fullback John Facchinei, who saw limited duty last year due to an injury.

He will be joined in the backfield by runningbacks Will Gruetzmacher and Kevin Feeney.

Scott O'Sullivan, who started both ways as a junior last year, will either be the quarterback or wide receiver on offense and return as the safety on defense.

Although Ray McCrann will be sorely missed, Leroy Horn, no stranger to Summit football, has taken Ray's place.

Leroy is one of the best runningbacks to have ever worn the maroon and white. He will be able to relate the history and tradition of Hilltopper Football to the younger generation.

With the turfing of Tatlock Field, the Hilltoppers will play only three home games, with the first home game against Parsippany Hills at 1:30 p.m. on Saturday, October 8, 2005.

Summit opens the season against Morris Hills on Saturday, September 10, 2005 at Morris Knolls High School with Summit as the home team.
